**Dr. Judy Bullock** is the Director of the Office of Worship for the Archdiocese of Louisville, Kentucky. She has conducted workshops on the rite *Sunday Celebrations in the Absence of a Priest* and most recently spoke at the USCCB/FDLC workshops *Deepen, Nurture, Celebrate, Welcoming the Third Edition of the Roman Missal*. Judy is the treasurer of the National Federation of Diocesan Liturgical Commissions and is an active member of FDLC Region 5.

**Todd Williamson** is the director of the Office for Divine Worship for the Archdiocese of Chicago. He is a noted speaker whose experience includes teaching, campus ministry, and parish ministry with liturgy and the catechumenate. He is co-author of *Let the Mystery Lead You! Bringing Liturgy and Catechesis Together* (XXIII Publications), the author in 2007 and 2008 of *Sourcebook for Sundays and Seasons* (Liturgy Training Publications) and contributor to *RTJ* (*Religion Teachers Journal*), *Rite and Pastoral Liturgy*, and *Catechumenate* journals.

### About the Day

The English translation of the Third Edition of the Roman Missal will be implemented in the United States on the First Sunday of Advent—November 27, 2011. During this time leading up to the implementation, day-long sessions of formation and information will be offered around the Diocese to various groups of ministers, for example: **deacons, parish life coordinators, musicians, liturgy directors, worship team members, catechists, parish staffs, parish pastoral council members, parish trustees and other parish leaders.**

These workshops are designed to explore the History of the Roman Missal and how the Third Edition of the Roman Missal, in particular, developed, situating it in the principles outlined in the *Constitution on the Sacred Liturgy* from the Second Vatican Council. **Participants will engage in conversation on how, in their specific ministry, they can assist the faithful** (adults, youth, children) to go beyond the technical changes in the texts to affect real change in the liturgical life of the parish community, as it continues to live the vision of the Second Vatican Council.
